



AMANDARI

Fact Sheet



Located in the cultural heart of Bali, Amandari guides guests to encounter the island's beguiling face and discover its soul. Amandari is framed by jungle and rice terraces in Bali's cultural heartland. Alang-alang thatched houses – some with pools, all with private tropical gardens – cosset guests under bamboo ceilings, their suites elegantly decorated with teak and coconut wood.

The grounds are both sacred and essential to local families: children attend dance classes here, and religious processions pass through regularly, leading down the steps that spill below Amandari to a 7th-century stone tiger – a motif repeated throughout the property.

Locations

Amandari lies in the village of Kedewatan, part of Bali's cultural capital, Ubud, which is a 10-minute drive away. Hidden on a hillside overlooking rice terraces and the wilderness of the Ayung Valley.

Getting There

- Around 1,5 hour drive north of Denpasar Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS)
- Ngurah Rai International Airport (DPS) is served by carriers including Singapore Airlines, Garuda Indonesia, Qatar Airways, Emirates, Qantas Airways, Turkish Airlines, KLM Airlines, Korean Air, Cathay Pacific, Thai Airways, Malaysia Airlines, Scoot, and Jetstar
- The complimentary airport concierge service includes customs clearance assistance and car transfers
- Cars are equipped with Wi-Fi, refreshments, snacks, and the Amandari Experience Guide book

Accommodation

Situated near Ubud, and surrounded by traditional paras-stone walls, each of the 31 freestanding suites is accessed by a traditional Balinese stone gateway. Amandari's thatched-roof Suites, which open on three sides via sliding glass doors to lush garden courtyards and feature coconut and teak wood accents.

Dining

Exposed to cooling mountain breezes, the open-air main Restaurant and adjacent Bar enjoy spectacular views of the main Amandari pool and the Ayung River Valley.

The Restaurant

- 50 seats in the lower-level area
- Open for breakfast, lunch, dinner and wine tasting
- Serves International, Indonesian, and Balinese cuisine
- Provides alfresco seating which overlooks the main swimming pool

The Dining Balé

- 2 open-air dining Balés
- 4 seats per Balé
- Open for breakfast, lunch and dinner
- Views of the lush green mountains and Ayung Valley
- Provides alfresco seating which overlooks the main swimming pool

The Lotus Pond

- Seats 8 guests
- Available for dinner
- Open and intimate environment surrounded by a small lotus pond
- Reservation for the Lotus Pond is needed

The Bar

- Seats 22 guests
- Located opposite The Restaurant
- Ideal spot for refreshing drinks and sundowners
- Ranging from snacks, light meals, light beverages, soft drinks, juices, mocktails, cocktails, liquors, spirits, wines, and selections of cigars
- Overlooks the main swimming pool

Activities & Experiences

Ubud is known as the cultural heart of Bali, discover the unique lives of the Balinese, their Hindu rituals, and unique craftsmanship through tours or comprehensive activities.

Village Artisan

Visit the tucked-away village ateliers of silversmiths, wood carvers, and Balinese painters, or take a lesson with an artist living nearby.

Spend a peaceful morning or afternoon with a local Balinese artist with a private painting session at Amandari. Create anything from a simple local shrine to a colourful natural scene of Amandari's surroundings.

Balinese Healing

Take part in a traditional Balinese healing practice with Made Lunas during a private session at his local home. Bali's traditions are deeply rooted in holistic healing, which is demonstrated through this transformational experience, including readings on subjects such as health, love, and career (present and future) which aim to heal the body and open the mind.

Water Blessing and Balinese Numerology

The spiritual side of local life can also be uncovered with an early morning water purification and meditation at Pura Mengening, a beautiful nearby water temple. These ancient Balinese rituals are followed by breakfast before a numerology session – an ancient study that draws meaning from different numbers - with a Balinese shaman. This awakening journey is led by Luh Manis, a Jero priestess from the local area, who also helps to translate along the way.

Cycling or Trekking

From its perch above the Ayung River Gorge, Amandari offers countless trails and pathways leading into the natural wonderland that surrounds the resort. Cycling or Trekking is a superb way to experience Balinese daily life and nature up close and personal, whether peddling through remote villages, trekking through lush jungles, crossing verdant rice paddies, or freewheeling down endless downhill on quiet back roads.

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
