Serenity in Central Java's cultural heartland. Perfectly placed for exploring the region's historic and natural attractions, or for simply relaxing in blissful surroundings.

Framed by emerald-green rice plains and the peaks of the Menoreh Hills in rural Central Java, Amanjiwo lies within view of the mystical stupas of Borobudur, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. The Buddhist monument directly informs the design of Amanjiwo, a temple-like hideaway with a towering domed roof, colonnades, and walls built of local bluish-beige paras stone.

Locations

The fifth-largest island of the Indonesian archipelago and the most populous which is filled with an abundance of history of various cultures, Java lies between Sumatra and Bali, with the Java Sea to the north, and the Indian Ocean to the south. The lush landscape surrounding Amanjiwo is volcanic and ruggedly beautiful, and the area, scattered with temples and ruins is considered Indonesia's cultural heartland.

Train Journey Inclusions

Candi Borobudur

UNESCO World Heritage Site of Borobudur is one of the world's best-preserved ancient monuments. Exploring Borobudur is very spiritual, truly an experience of a lifetime and mere words cannot convey the feelings that it inspires. Borobudur can be reached with a pleasant 25-minute walk or cycle ride from Amanjiwo. A dawn visit is highly recommended for witnessing the sunrise over the 9th-century Buddhas and enjoying sweeping views of the volcanic landscape.

Cycling

Cycling is an enchanting way of soaking in the atmosphere of Kampung (village) life and reaching into the soul of Java.

Ruwatan

A guided ruwatan, a purification ritual, is available at the Progo River area for guests to complete the tranquil self-healing retreat at Amanjiwo. Guided by Joko Triagung, a renowned healer-shaman in Yogyakarta Province and is also a master of Kebatinan (inner-directed, mystical spirituality) with a focus on Tenaga Dalam, which literally means inner power, prana, and chi.
